 - Constitution
 - Codes
 - Regulations
 - Courts of Appeal and Supreme Court Cases

- Paid Westlaw and LexisNexis
 - Subscription (\$\$\$\$)
 - Pay as you go document retrieval
- Advantages:
 - Many more search options and hyperlinks
 - Many more sources (esp. secondary)
 - "Law library in a box"
