Surface Water

- **Problem**: Observed polluted storm water leaving a construction site discharging to a storm drain.
- Regulators
 - US EPA
 - State Water Resources Control Board
 - Regional Water Quality Control Bds.
 - City and County Watershed Depts.
 - District Attorney

Surface Water – Laws

- Clean Water Act
 - Controls discharges from construction, industrial, municipal and some agricultural sites
 - Must discharge to waters of the United States
 - Regulates through National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits
- Porter-Cologne Water Quality Act (Cal.)
 - Controls discharges to waters of the state through Water Discharge Regulations
 - Limitations often included in NPDES permits.

Groundwater

- Clean Water Act does <u>not</u> apply to groundwater
- Exception Connectivity with WOTUS
- Groundwater Ambient Monitoring and Assessment (GAMA) Program
 - <u>https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/gama/</u>
 - Includes a searchable GIS map to identify toxic plumes and LUSTs
 - Groundwater quality data from California and USGS
- Report concerns via Cal EPA website or to your local Regional Board

Drinking Water

- **Issue**: You have concerns about contaminated drinking water quality and don't know what's in your water.
- Consult:
 - Water District Drinking Water Info
 - GAMA and USGS Data
 - SWRCB Div. of Drinking Water https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/drinki ng_water/programs/

• Look for:

- Maximum Contaminant Levels
 - Federal v. California MCLs
- Concerns: perchlorate, PFAS (now)
- Check your service area:

Drinking Water

• Safe Drinking Water Act

- Applies to every public water system (PWS) in America
- Does not cover:
 - Private wells
 - Bottled Water
 - Facilities operating own water system (e.g., schools, office bldgs., hospitals, factories)

• Requires

• EPA to establish National Primary Drinking Water Regulations for contaminants that may cause adverse public health effects

• Consult
